Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to amend Schedule 1 to the *Drug Misuse and Trafficking Act 1985*. Schedule 1 lists plants and drugs that are prohibited for the purposes of the Act. The proposed amendments remove a substance that is listed under 2 different names and make it clear that the substance known as 4-Methoxyamphetamine is the same as the substance known as Paramethoxyamphetamine.

This Regulation is made under the *Drug Misuse and Trafficking Act 1985*, including sections 44 and 45 (the general regulation-making power).

1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the *Drug Misuse and Trafficking Amendment (Prohibited Drug) Regulation 2009*.

2 Commencement

This Regulation commences on the day on which it is published on the NSW legislation website.

3 Amendment of Drug Misuse and Trafficking Act 1985 No 226

(1) Schedule 1

Insert “(also known as Paramethoxyamphetamine)” after “4-Methoxyamphetamine”.

(2) Schedule 1

Omit all the matter relating to Paramethoxyamphetamine.
