Explanatory note

The object of this Order is to amend the list of medical conditions that must be notified by laboratories to the Director-General of the Ministry of Health by adding Hendra virus infection and Rotavirus, reducing the blood lead level for lead poisoning and updating the description of the *E. coli* infection.

This Order is made under section 51 (2) of the *Public Health Act 2010*.

1 Name of Order

This Order is the *Public Health Amendment (Scheduled Medical Conditions) Order 2012*.

2 Commencement

This Order commences on the day on which it is published on the NSW legislation website.

3 Amendment of Public Health Act 2010 No 127

(1) Schedule 1 Scheduled medical conditions

Insert the following in alphabetical order in Category 3:

Hendra virus infection

Rotavirus

Shiga toxin-producing and Vero toxin-producing
Escherichia coli infection (STEC/VTEC)

(2) Schedule 1, Category 3

Omit “Lead poisoning (as defined by a blood lead level of or above 15µg/dL)”.

Insert instead “Lead poisoning (as defined by a blood lead level of or above 10µg/dL)”.

(3) Schedule 1, Category 3

Omit “Verotoxin-producing *Escherichia coli* infection”.
