Her Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following Regulation under the *Lotteries and Art Unions Act 1901*.

Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to increase the fees payable under the *Lotteries and Art Unions Act 1901* in respect of:

- (a) an application for a permit under section 4B of the Act to conduct a lottery or game of chance for trade promotion, and
- (b) an application for amendment of a permit under that section of the Act.

The fees have not been increased since 1 September 2007.

This Regulation is made under the *Lotteries and Art Unions Act 1901*, including section 23 (the general regulation-making power).

1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the *Lotteries and Art Unions Amendment (Fees) Regulation 2012*.
