## Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to allow a party to proceedings before the Consumer, Trader and Tenancy Tribunal to apply for permission to be represented by another person if the proceedings relate to a tenancy (within the meaning of the *Agricultural Tenancies Act 1990*) and involve a claim or dispute for an amount exceeding \$30,000.

This Regulation is made under the *Consumer, Trader and Tenancy Tribunal Act 2001*, including section 36 (2) and section 86 (the general regulation-making power).

**1 Name of Regulation**

This Regulation is the *Consumer, Trader and Tenancy Tribunal Amendment (Representation) Regulation 2012*.

**2 Commencement**

This Regulation commences on 1 August 2012 and is required to be published on the NSW legislation website.

**3 Amendment of Consumer, Trader and Tenancy Tribunal Regulation 2009**

**Clause 14 Circumstances in which application may be made**

Insert after clause 14 (r):

- (s) if the proceedings relate to a tenancy (within the meaning of the *Agricultural Tenancies Act 1990*) and involve a claim or dispute for an amount exceeding \$30,000.
