Schedule 1 Employers

Insert at the end of Part 1:

Harbour City Ferries Pty Ltd (limited to those persons who, immediately before 28 July 2012, were employed on a permanent basis by Sydney Ferries and:

- on that date, transferred their employment to (a) Harbour City Ferries Pty Ltd, or
- were covered by the Sydney Ferries Salaried and (b) Senior Officers Agreement 2011, commenced employment with Harbour City Ferries Pty Ltd between 28 July 2012 and 28 October 2012 (inclusive), were not made an offer of employment by Harbour City Ferries Pty Ltd before 28 July 2012 and did not receive a voluntary redundancy payment from Sydney Ferries)
