Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to amend the *Oaths Regulation 2011* to enable a police identification card issued to a police officer by the Commissioner of Police to be used as an identification document by an authorised witness for a statutory declaration or affidavit.

This Regulation is made under the *Oaths Act 1900*, including sections 34 and 35 (the general regulation-making power).

Insert after paragraph (i) of the definition of *identification document* in clause 3 (1):

(j) a police identification card issued to a police officer by the Commissioner of Police.
