Explanatory note

The Road Transport (Safety and Traffic Management) Act 1999 enables an authorised officer to remove an illegally parked vehicle from a prescribed place if the officer considers the vehicle is causing, or unless removed is likely to cause, danger to the public or undue traffic congestion. The object of this Regulation is to prescribe a freeway as a prescribed place from which an illegally parked vehicle may be so removed.

This Regulation is made under the *Road Transport (Safety and Traffic Management) Act* 1999, including sections 71 (the general regulation-making power) and 76.

1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the Road Transport (Safety and Traffic Management) Amendment (Removal of Unattended Vehicles) Regulation 2012.

2 Commencement

(e) a freeway within the meaning of the *Road Rules* 2008.
