Explanatory note

The object of this Order is to add certain substances (namely Benzodiazepines and Zolpidem) to the list of substances in Schedule 1 to the *Drug and Alcohol Treatment Act 2007*. As a result, a person who has a severe substance dependence in relation to such substances may be involuntarily detained and treated under that Act.

This Order is made under section 54 of the *Drug and Alcohol Treatment Act 2007*.
