Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to declare the *Criminal Investigation (Covert Powers) Act 2012* of Western Australia to be a corresponding law for the purposes of the *Law Enforcement and National Security (Assumed Identities) Act 2010*, in order to recognise and give effect in New South Wales to the authorisation of assumed identities under the Western Australian Act.

This Regulation is made under the *Law Enforcement and National Security (Assumed Identities) Act 2010*, including sections 4 (1) (which provides for the declaration of corresponding laws) and 42 (the general regulation-making power).
