Explanatory note

Section 6 of the *Parliamentary Remuneration Act 1989* provides for holders of certain offices specified in Schedule 1 to that Act to receive a salary and expense allowance in addition to the basic salary to which they are entitled as members of Parliament. The additional salary and expense allowance to be received is expressed as a percentage of the basic salary.

The object of this Regulation is to amend Schedule 1 to specify the percentage of additional salary and expense allowance for the Deputy Premier when acting for and on behalf of the Premier under section 36 of the *Constitution Act 1902*.

This Regulation is made under the *Parliamentary Remuneration Act 1989*, including section 6 (4) and section 21 (the general regulation-making power).
