

Rural Fires Amendment (Penalty Notice Offences) Regulation 2014

Her Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following Regulation under the *Rural Fires Act 1997*.

Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to increase the amount of the penalty for prescribed offences in relation to which an authorised officer may serve a penalty notice on a person if it appears to the officer that the person has committed the offence. This Regulation also prescribes section 99A of the Act as a prescribed offence in relation to which an authorised officer may serve a penalty notice, and prescribes a penalty amount for the offence.

This Regulation is made under the *Rural Fires Act 1997*, including sections 131 (6) and 135 (the general regulation-making power).
