Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to introduce certain new fees in respect of the Supreme Court for publishing on the NSW Online Registry website a notice of intended distribution (\$41) or a notice of application for passing accounts (\$41) and for republishing a notice of intention to apply for a grant of representation or a resale of a grant of representation (\$17), a notice of intended distribution (\$17) or a notice of application for passing accounts (\$17).

This Regulation is made under the *Civil Procedure Act 2005*, including section 18 (1) (Fees).
