

Public Health Amendment (Scheduled Medical Conditions) Order 2015

Explanatory note

The object of this Order is to amend the *Public Health Act 2010* to add acute rheumatic fever and rheumatic heart disease in a person under the age of 35 years to:

- (a) the list of medical conditions in Schedule 1 to that Act that must be notified by medical practitioners to the Secretary of the Ministry of Health, and
- (b) the list of notifiable diseases in Schedule 2 to that Act:
 - (i) that must be notified by health practitioners providing care in hospitals to the chief executive officer of the hospital concerned, and
 - (ii) that must be notified by the chief executive officer of a hospital to the Secretary of the Ministry of Health.

This Order is made under sections 51 (2) and 81 of the Public Health Act 2010.

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1 Name of Order

This Order is the Public Health Amendment (Scheduled Medical Conditions) Order 2015.

2 Commencement

This Order commences on the day on which it is published on the NSW legislation website.
