## Explanatory note

The object of this Order is to include the Royal Institute for Deaf and Blind Children in the list of employers in Schedule 1 to the *State Authorities Non-contributory Superannuation Act 1987* (*the Act*). As a result, those persons who were employees of the University of Sydney immediately before 1 July 2014 and on that date transferred their employment to the Royal Institute for Deaf and Blind Children will continue to be employees for the purposes of the Act.
