Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to amend the *Forestry Regulation 2012* to prescribe the Chief Executive of the Office of Environment and Heritage as a person to whom the Minister may delegate the exercise of certain functions for forestry areas for which the Chief Executive is the land manager.

This Regulation is made under the *Forestry Act 2012*, including sections 90 and 92 (the general regulation-making power).

1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the *Forestry Amendment (Delegation) Regulation 2016*.

2 Commencement

This Regulation commences on the day on which it is published on the NSW legislation website.

3 Amendment of Forestry Regulation 2012

(1) Clause 54

Insert “**of Corporation**” at the end of the heading to the clause.

(2) Clause 55 Delegation of certain functions of Minister

Insert at the end of the clause:

- (2) For the purposes of section 90 of the Act, the Chief Executive of the Office of Environment and Heritage is authorised as a person to whom the Minister may delegate the exercise of the following functions of the Minister:
- (a) the appointment under section 70 of the Act of employees of the Office as authorised officers for forestry areas for which the Chief Executive is the land manager,
 - (b) the issuing of identification cards under section 72 of the Act to such authorised officers (including the signing of any such card),
 - (c) the function of approving forest permits under section 61 (1) of the Act for forestry areas for which the Chief Executive is the land manager.
