Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to provide that the Commissioner of Police may order the destruction of photographs, finger-prints and palm-prints taken in respect of a person in lawful custody without contravening a prohibition in the *State Records Act 1998* on the disposal of State records.

This Regulation is made under the *State Records Act 1998*, including sections 21 (2) (b) and 81 (the general regulation-making power).
