Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to declare certain land to be the Barwon-Darling Valley Floodplain for the purposes of the *Water Management Act 2000*.

This Regulation is made under the *Water Management Act 2000*, including section 400 (the general regulation-making power) and the definition of ***floodplain*** in the Dictionary.

1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the *Water Management (General) Amendment (Floodplain) Regulation 2017*.

2 Commencement

This Regulation commences on the day on which it is published on the NSW legislation website.

Schedule 1 Amendment of Water Management (General) Regulation 2011

[1] Clause 226AA Land declared to be a floodplain

Omit clause 226AA (1). Insert instead:

- (1) For the purposes of the definition of *floodplain* in the Dictionary to the Act:
 - (a) the land shown edged in heavy black on the map in Part 1 of Schedule 7A is declared to be the Gwydir Valley Floodplain, and
 - (b) the land shown edged in heavy black on the map in Part 2 of Schedule 7A is declared to be the Barwon-Darling Valley Floodplain.
