Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Amendment (Supply of Vaccines by Pharmacists) Regulation 2020

Her Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following Regulation under the *Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Act 1966*.

Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to amend the *Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Regulation 2008* to enable appropriately trained pharmacists to supply and administer the influenza, measles-mumps-rubella combination and diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis vaccines without a prescription outside of retail pharmacies provided the pharmacists act in accordance with practice standards approved by the Secretary of the Ministry of Health.

This Regulation is made under the *Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Act 1966*, including sections 17(1) and 45C (the general regulation-making power).

1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the *Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Amendment (Supply of Vaccines by Pharmacists) Regulation 2020*.

2 Commencement

This Regulation commences on the day on which it is published on the NSW legislation website.

3 Amendment of Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Regulation 2008

(1) Clause 48A Supply by pharmacists of certain vaccines

Omit “at a retail pharmacy” from clause 48A(1).

(2) Clause 48A(2)(g)

Omit “pharmacy”. Insert instead “place”.
