# Surveillance Devices Amendment (Body-Worn Recording Devices) Regulation 2020

under the

Surveillance Devices Act 2007

Her Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following Regulation under the *Surveillance Devices Act 2007*.

## Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to extend the trial period during which ambulance officers will be exempt from sections 7 and 8 of the *Surveillance Devices Act 2007*. Those sections prohibit the installation and use of listening devices and optical surveillances devices. The trial period, which is due to expire on 30 November 2020, is to be extended by this Regulation to 30 November 2021.

This Regulation is made under the *Surveillance Devices Act 2007*, including section 59 (the general regulation-making power).

### **1 Name of Regulation**

This Regulation is the *Surveillance Devices Amendment (Body-Worn Recording Devices) Regulation 2020*.
