Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to allow for the issue of penalty notices for an offence against the *Public Health Act 2010*, section 10 involving a contravention of a Ministerial direction under the *Public Health (COVID-19 Spitting and Coughing) Order (No 2) 2021* about intentionally spitting or coughing on a public official or other worker in a way that is likely to cause fear about the spread of COVID-19.

This Regulation is made under the *Public Health Act 2010*, including sections 118 and 134 (the general regulation-making power).

1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the *Public Health Amendment (COVID-19 Spitting and Coughing) Regulation (No 2) 2021*.

2 Commencement

This Regulation commences on 28 May 2021 and is required to be published on the NSW legislation website.

Schedule 4 Penalty notice offences

Omit “*Public Health (COVID-19 Spitting and Coughing) Order 2021*” from the entry relating to the Act, section 10 under the heading “Part 1 Offences under the Act”.

Insert instead “*Public Health (COVID-19 Spitting and Coughing) Order (No 2) 2021*”.
