## **Explanatory note**

The object of this Regulation is to increase certain fees imposed under various legislation relating to justice. The fee increases are generally in line with movements in the Consumer Price Index.

## **Justice Legislation Amendment (Fees) Regulation 2021**

### **1 Name of Regulation**

This Regulation is the *Justice Legislation Amendment (Fees) Regulation 2021*.

### **2 Commencement**

This Regulation commences on 1 July 2021 and is required to be published on the NSW legislation website.
