1 Name of Order

This Order is the Administrative Arrangements (Administrative Changes—Ministers and Public Service Agencies) Order (No 3) 2021.

2 Commencement

This Order commences at 3:30pm on 6 October 2021 and is required to be published on the NSW legislation website.

3 Definitions

In this Order—

document means any Act or statutory or other instrument, or any contract or agreement.

reference, to a Minister, includes a reference that by or under any Act is to be construed or treated as a reference to that Minister.

Note— The *Constitution Act 1902*, Part 7 and the *Interpretation Act 1987* also contain definitions and other provisions that affect the interpretation and application of this Order.

4 Allocation of the administration of Acts

- (1) The administration of the Acts listed in Schedule 1 are allocated to the Ministers indicated in that Schedule.
- (2) The administration of Acts or parts of Acts that directly amend other Acts are allocated to the Ministers administering the Act amended.
- (3) The allocations made by this Order replace any previous allocations relating to the Acts concerned that are inconsistent with the allocations made by this Order.

Note— See the *Interpretation Act 1987*, section 15 for the interpretation of references to "the Minister" in an Act.

5 Amendment of allocation of the administration of Acts—seniority
