

# Roads Amendment (Major Bridges and Tunnels) Regulation (No 2) 2022

under the

Roads Act 1993

Her Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following Regulation under the *Roads Act 1993*.

### **Explanatory note**

The object of this Regulation is to amend the *Roads Regulation 2018* to prescribe further major bridges or tunnels for the purposes of the *Roads Act 1993*, section 144G. Section 144G creates an offence for a person who trespasses on a major bridge or tunnel, including by seriously disrupting or obstructing vehicles or pedestrians attempting to use the bridge or tunnel if the person's conduct causes the bridge or tunnel to be closed or vehicles or pedestrians redirected.

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#### 1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the *Roads Amendment (Major Bridges and Tunnels) Regulation (No 2) 2022.* 

#### 2 Commencement

This Regulation commences on the day on which it is published on the NSW legislation website.

#### 3 Amendment of Roads Regulation 2018

#### Clause 48A Major bridge or tunnel

Omit clause 48A(1) except the example. Insert instead—

- (1) For the Act, section 144G, definition of *major bridge or tunnel*, the following are prescribed for the purposes of that section—
  - (a) a bridge or tunnel in—
    - (i) the Greater Sydney Region, or
    - (ii) the City of Newcastle, or
    - (iii) the City of Wollongong,
  - (b) a bridge or tunnel that joins—
    - (i) a main road, or
    - (ii) a highway, or
    - (iii) a freeway.
