Roads Amendment (Major Roads) Regulation 2022

Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to amend the *Roads Regulation 2018*, consequent on the enactment of the *Roads and Crimes Legislation Amendment Act 2022*, to prescribe major bridges, tunnels and roads for the purposes of the *Roads Act 1993*, section 144G. Section 144G creates an offence for a person who trespasses on a major bridge, tunnel or road if the conduct—

- (a) causes damage to the bridge, tunnel or road, or
- (b) seriously disrupts or obstructs vehicles or pedestrians attempting to use the bridge, tunnel or road.

1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the *Roads Amendment (Major Roads) Regulation 2022*.

2 Commencement

This Regulation commences on the day on which it is published on the NSW legislation website.

3 Amendment of Roads Regulation 2018

(1) **Clause 48A, heading**

Omit “or tunnel”. Insert instead “, **tunnel or road**”.

(2) **Clause 48A(1)**

Omit “*or tunnel*”. Insert instead “, **tunnel or road**”.

(3) **Clause 48A(1)(a)–(f)**

Omit clause 48A(1)(a) and (b). Insert instead—

- (a) a main road,
- (b) a highway,
- (c) a freeway,
- (d) a tollway,
- (e) a bridge or tunnel that joins a road referred to in paragraphs (a)–(d),
- (f) a bridge or tunnel in—
 - (i) the Greater Sydney Region, or
 - (ii) the City of Newcastle, or
 - (iii) the City of Wollongong.
