### **Explanatory note**

The object of this Order is to include the National Heavy Vehicle Regulator (the *NHVR*) in the list of employers in the *State Authorities Non-contributory Superannuation 1987*, Schedule 1.

As a result, a person may continue to be a contributor to the State Superannuation Fund or the State Authorities Superannuation Fund for the purposes of the Act if—

- (a) the person's employment was transferred to the NHVR by ministerial order under the *Transport Administration Act 1988*, Schedule 7, clause 233, and
- (b) immediately before the person's employment was transferred, the person was a contributor to either Fund.

#### 1 Name of Order

## 3 Amendment of State Authorities Non-contributory Superannuation Act 1987 No 212 Schedule 1 Employers

Insert at the end of Part 1—

The National Heavy Vehicle Regulator (the NHVR), limited to persons—

- (a) whose employment was transferred to the NHVR by ministerial order under the *Transport Administration Act 1988*, Schedule 7, clause 233, and
- (b) who, immediately before their employment was transferred, were contributors to the State Superannuation Fund or the State Authorities Superannuation Fund.
