### 1 Name of Rule

This Rule is the *Uniform Civil Procedure (Amendment No 99) Rule 2022*.

### 2 Commencement

This Rule commences on the day on which it is published on the NSW legislation website.

### 3 Amendment of Uniform Civil Procedure Rules 2005

#### (1) Rule 7.1 By whom proceedings may be commenced and carried on

Omit “by a commercial agent with respect to debt collection (within the meaning of the *Commercial Agents and Private Inquiry Agents Act 2004*)” from rule 7.1(5)(a).

Insert instead “by a person who carries out commercial agent activity that is debt collection within the meaning of section 60 of the *Fair Trading Act 1987*”.

#### (2) Rule 35.3 Persons who may make affidavit

Omit “by a commercial agent with respect to debt collection (within the meaning of the *Commercial Agents and Private Inquiry Agents Act 2004*)” from rule 35.3(2)(a).

Insert instead “by a person who carries out commercial agent activity that is debt collection within the meaning of section 60 of the *Fair Trading Act 1987*”.
