Her Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following Regulation under the *Public Health Act 2010*.

Explanatory note

This Regulation prescribes a penalty notice amount of \$1,000 if a person fails to comply with a direction of the Minister for Health requiring the person to give notification that the person has tested positive to COVID-19 as a result of a rapid antigen test.

This Regulation is made under the *Public Health Act 2010*, including sections 118 and 134, the general regulation-making power.
