Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Amendment (Alternative Address) Regulation 2023

under the

Road Transport Act 2013

Her Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following regulation under the *Road Transport Act 2013*.

Explanatory note

The object of this regulation is to amend the *Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Regulation 2017* to additionally provide that Transport for NSW may issue a driver licence showing an alternative address for the following persons—

- (a) a person who was previously—
 - (i) a judicial officer within the meaning of the *Judicial Officers Act 1986*, or
 - (ii) a Crown Prosecutor appointed under the *Crown Prosecutors Act 1986*, or
 - (iii) a police officer if the NSW driver licence register indicates that information relating to that officer's residential address is suppressed,
- (b) a person who lives at the same residential address as the person mentioned in paragraph (a).

This regulation is made under the *Road Transport Act 2013*, including section 4, definition of *driver licence* and section 23, the general statutory rule-making power.

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1 Name of regulation

This regulation is the *Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Amendment (Alternative Address) Regulation 2023*.

2 Commencement

This regulation commences on the day on which it is published on the NSW legislation website.

Schedule 1 Amendment of Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Regulation 2017

[1] Clause 10 Form of driver licence

Insert after clause 10(2)(c)—

- (c1) a person who was previously a person specified in paragraph (a), (b) or (c),

[2] Clause 10(2)(d)

Omit “or (c)”. Insert instead “, (c) or (c1)”.
