# Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration (Judicial and Other Office Holders) Regulation 2024

under the

Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration Act 1975

## Explanatory note

The object of this regulation is to repeal and remake, with amendments, the *Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration (Judicial and Other Office Holders) Regulation 2013* which would otherwise be repealed on 1 September 2024 by the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1989*, section 10(2).

This regulation declares the policies that the Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration Tribunal must give effect to when altering the remuneration of office holders to which the *Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration Act 1975*, Part 3, applies.

This regulation comprises or relates to matters set out in the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1989*, Schedule 3, namely—

- (a) matters of a machinery nature, and
- (b) matters that are not likely to impose an appreciable burden, cost or disadvantage on any sector of the public.

## Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration (Judicial and Other Office Holders) Regulation 2024

under the

Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration Act 1975

### 1 Name of regulation

This regulation is the *Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration (Judicial and Other Office Holders) Regulation 2024*.

### 2 Commencement

This regulation commences on the day on which it is published on the NSW legislation website.

**Note—** This regulation repeals and replaces the *Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration (Judicial and Other Office Holders) Regulation 2013*, which would otherwise be repealed on 1 September 2024 by the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1989*, section 10(2).

### 3 Definitions

In this regulation—

**office holder** has the same meaning as in the Act, Part 3.

**remuneration** has the same meaning as in the Act, Part 3.

**the Act** means the *Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration Act 1975*.

**Note—** The Act and the *Interpretation Act 1987* contain definitions and other provisions that affect the interpretation and application of this regulation.

### 4 Declarations of policy

For the Act, section 6AB(2)(a), the matters set out in this regulation are declared to be aspects of government policy that the Tribunal must give effect to when making a determination under the Act, Part 3 of an alteration in the remuneration to be paid to office holders.

### 5 Equal remuneration policy

For the Act, section 6AB(3), a policy of equal remuneration for persons, regardless of gender, for doing work of equal or comparable value is declared.

### 6 Temporary wages policy

- (1) For the Act, section 6AB(3), a policy that the Tribunal must not make a determination that has the effect of awarding an increase in remuneration that takes effect before 1 July 2025 is declared.
- (2) This section expires on 30 June 2025 at the end of the day.

### 7 Repeal and savings

- (1) The *Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration (Judicial and Other Office Holders) Regulation 2013* is repealed.

- (2) An act, matter or thing that, immediately before the repeal of the *Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration (Judicial and Other Office Holders) Regulation 2013*, had effect under that regulation continues to have effect under this regulation.
