## Explanatory note

The object of this order is to—

- (a) change references from “Monkeypox” to “Mpox”, and
- (b) add certain conditions to the list of scheduled medical conditions and notifiable diseases under the *Public Health Act 2010*.

This order is made under Henry VIII provisions that enable the making of orders to amend the *Public Health Act 2010*, Schedules 1 and 2.

### **1 Name of order**

This order is the *Public Health Amendment (Scheduled Medical Conditions and Notifiable Diseases) Order 2024*.

Omit “Monkeypox” wherever occurring. Insert instead “Mpox”.

Insert in alphabetical order under the heading “Category 2”—

*Streptococcus pyogenes* associated toxic shock syndrome (STSS)

*Streptococcus pyogenes* detected and associated with necrotising fasciitis

*Streptococcus pyogenes* detected and associated with puerperal or neonatal sepsis

**[3] Schedule 2 Notifiable diseases**

Omit “Monkeypox”. Insert instead “Mpox”.

**[4] Schedule 2**

Insert in alphabetical order—

*Streptococcus pyogenes* associated toxic shock syndrome (STSS)

*Streptococcus pyogenes* detected and associated with necrotising fasciitis

*Streptococcus pyogenes* detected and associated with puerperal or neonatal sepsis
