

LIQUOR (HOTELIERS) AMENDMENT BILL 1989

NEW SOUTH WALES



EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

The object of this Bill is to enable the holder of a hotelier's licence to apply to the Licensing Court for an extension of the trading hours on a Sunday during which liquor may be sold for consumption away from the licensed premises.

This would be on the same basis as has already been enacted (but not yet commenced) in relation to "take away" shops and registered clubs.

Clause 1 specifies the short title of the proposed Act.

Clause 2 provides for the commencement of the proposed Act on the date of assent.

Clause 3 provides for the amendment of the Liquor (Amendment) Act 1989 so that, on the commencement of that Act, the provisions relating to Sunday sales of liquor in hotels for consumption away from the licensed premises will be uniform in effect with those relating to other outlets.
