

SIMON UNIVERSITY COLLEGE (AMENDMENT) BILL 1989

NEW SOUTH WALES



EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

The object of this Bill is to amend the Simon University College Act 1988 so as to reconstitute the Australian William E. Simon University College as a university under the name of the Australian William E. Simon University.

Clause 1 specifies the short title of the proposed Act.

Clause 2 provides for the commencement of the proposed Act on a day to be appointed by proclamation.

Clause 3 is a formal provision that gives effect to the Schedule of amendments.

Clause 4 consists of a saving provision consequent on the change of name effected by the proposed Act.

SCHEDULE 1—AMENDMENTS

Schedule 1 (2) inserts a new section 2A. The proposed section renames the Australian William E. Simon University College as the Australian William E. Simon University.

Schedule 1 (1) and (3) make consequential amendments to the Principal Act as a consequence of the change of name of the University College to be effected by the new section 2A.

Schedule 1 (4) amends section 4 (Objects) so as to provide that the objects of the Principal Act include the statutory recognition of the University as a university.

Schedule 1 (5) substitutes section 5. The proposed section gives the University statutory recognition as a university and authorises its being called a university.

Schedule 1 (6) substitutes section 7. The proposed section confers on the University the power to confer degrees on its own behalf and on behalf of other bodies rather than, as is currently the case, merely on behalf of the University of Rochester School of Business Administration.
