AREA HEALTH SERVICES (ELECTIONS) AMENDMENT BILL 1989

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

Each area health board constituted under the Area Health Services Act 1986 has, as one of the members appointed by the Minister, a person known as the elected staff member who is elected in accordance with the regulations.

A person who could otherwise be nominated for election as the elected staff member cannot at present be nominated as a candidate unless, in addition to other qualifications:

- (a) he or she is a member of a prescribed industrial union or association of employees; and
- (b) the instrument of nomination is accompanied by a statutory declaration verifying that membership.

The object of this Bill is to remove those restrictions and retain the remaining qualifications so that any person who:

- (a) is an employee of the area health service; and
- (b) is nominated as a candidate by at least 2 other employees of the area health service,

is eligible to be a candidate for election as the elected staff member.

Clause 1 specifie	s the short title of	the proposed Act.

Clause 2 provides for the proposed A:t to commence on a day to be proclaimed.

Clause 3 amends the Area Health Services Act 1986 in order to give effect to the object stated above.
