Crimes Legislation Amendment (War Memorial Offences) Bill 2025

Act No , 2025

An Act to amend the Crimes Act 1900 and the Summary Offences Act 1988 regarding offences committed in relation to war memorials.

The Legislature of New South Wales enacts—

1 Name of Act

This Act is the Crimes Legislation Amendment (War Memorial Offences) Act 2025.

2 Commencement

This Act commences on the date of assent to this Act.

Schedule 1 Amendment of Crimes Act 1900 No 40

[1] Section 195 Destroying or damaging property

Insert after section 195(1)—

- (1AA) A person is guilty of an offence under this subsection if—
 - (a) the person intentionally or recklessly destroys or damages property belonging to another person or to that person and another person, and
 - (b) the property is a war memorial.

Maximum penalty—imprisonment for 7 years.

[2] Section 195(3)

Insert after section 195(2)—

(3) In this section—

war memorial has the same meaning as in the Summary Offences Act 1988, section 8.

Schedule 2 Amendment of Summary Offences Act 1988 No 25

Section 8 Damaging or desecrating protected places

Insert after section 8(3A)—

- (3B) If a person is convicted of an offence under this section in relation to a war memorial, the court may order the person to pay to the person who has control or management of the war memorial compensation of not more than \$4,400 for damage or defacement of the war memorial or a loss incurred as a result of the offence.
- (3C) Compensation payable under subsection (3B) is in addition to any fine or other penalty imposed in relation to the offence.
