## Electoral Funding Amendment Bill 2023

## Explanatory note

This explanatory note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament.

## Overview of Bill

The object of this Bill is to amend the Electoral Funding Act 2018 to increase the cap on electoral expenditure by third-party campaigners for State election campaigns from $\$ 20,000$ to $\$ 225,900$, indexed for inflation in line with other caps on electoral expenditure under the Act. This amendment implements a recommendation of the Joint Standing Committee on Electoral Matters in its report entitled Caps on third-party campaigners' electoral expenditure in s29(11) and s35 of the Electoral Funding Act 2018.

## Outline of provisions

Clause 1 sets out the name, also called the short title, of the proposed Act.
Clause 2 provides for the commencement of the proposed Act on the date of assent to the proposed Act.
