Her Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following Regulation under the *Sporting Venues (Invasions) Act 2003*.

1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the Sporting Venues (Invasions) Regulation 2011.

2 Commencement

This Regulation commences on 1 September 2011 and is required to be published on the NSW legislation website.

Note-

This Regulation replaces the *Sporting Venues (Invasions) Regulation 2006* which is repealed on 1 September 2011 by section 10 (2) of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1989*.

3 Definitions

(1) In this Regulation:

the Act means the Sporting Venues (Invasions) Act 2003.

(2) Notes included in this Regulation do not form part of this Regulation.

4 Designated sporting venues

The EnergyAustralia Stadium in Newcastle (also known as Newcastle Stadium) is prescribed as a designated sporting venue for the purposes of the Act.
