1 Name of Order

This Order is the [Public Holidays Order 2011](#).

2 Commencement

This Order commences on the day on which it is published on the NSW legislation website.

3 Definition

In this Order—

the Act means the [Public Holidays Act 2010](#).

4 Public holidays for a specified part of the State

For the purposes of section 5(1) of the Act, a day or part-day specified in Column 2 is declared to be a public holiday for the part of the State specified in Column 1—
