1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the *Sporting Venues (Invasions) Regulation 2011*.

2 Commencement

This Regulation commences on 1 September 2011 and is required to be published on the NSW legislation website.

Note—

This Regulation replaces the *Sporting Venues (Invasions) Regulation 2006* which is repealed on 1 September 2011 by section 10 (2) of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1989*.

3 Definitions

(1) In this Regulation:

the Act means the *Sporting Venues (Invasions) Act 2003*.

(2) Notes included in this Regulation do not form part of this Regulation.

4 Designated sporting venues

The following are prescribed as designated sporting venues for the purposes of the Act:

- (a) Central Coast Stadium at Dane Drive, Gosford,
- (b) Wollongong Stadium at Harbour Street, Wollongong,
- (c) Newcastle Stadium at Turton Road, Broadmeadow.
