1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the *Mutual Recognition (Automatic Licensed Occupations Recognition)*Regulation 2014.

2 Commencement

This Regulation commences on 1 December 2014 and is required to be published on the NSW legislation website.

3 Definitions

(1) In this Regulation:

the Act means the Mutual Recognition (Automatic Licensed Occupations Recognition) Act 2014.

(2) Notes included in this Regulation do not form part of this Regulation.

4 Local licences, recognised licences and deemed local licences

- (1) For the purposes of the definition of *local licence* in section 3 (1) of the Act, each licence that is listed in Column 2 of the table in Schedule 1 is prescribed as a local licence.
- (2) For the purposes of the definition of **recognised licence** in section 3 (1) of the Act, each licence issued under a law of another jurisdiction that is listed in Column 1 of the table in Schedule 1 is prescribed as a recognised licence.
- (3) For the purposes of section 4 (1) of the Act, each local licence listed in Column 2 of the table in Schedule 1 is prescribed as equivalent to the recognised licence or group of licences listed alongside it in Column 1.

An unrestricted electrician's licence held by an individual under the Construction Occupations (Licensing) Act 2004 of the Australian Capital Territory

An unrestricted electrical mechanic licence held by A supervisor certificate under the Home Building Act an individual under the Electrical Safety Act 2002 of Queensland

An unrestricted electrical mechanic licence and an electrical contractor licence, both held by the same individual, under the Electrical Safety Act 2002 of Queensland

An electrician's licence held by an electrical installation worker under the *Electricity Safety Act* 1998 of Victoria

An electrician's licence held by an electrical installation worker who is also a registered electrical contractor under the Electricity Safety Act 1998 of Victoria
