Liquor Amendment (Special Events Hotel Trading) Act 2002 No 29



New South Wales

An Act to amend the *Liquor Act 1982* to enable hotel trading until midnight on the night of the 2002 FIFA World Cup soccer final and until midnight on a Sunday on which an event of State, national or international significance is held.

1 Name of Act

This Act is the *Liquor Amendment (Special Events Hotel Trading) Act 2002*.

2 Commencement

This Act commences on the date of assent.

3 Amendment of *Liquor Act 1982 No 147*

The *Liquor Act 1982* is amended as set out in Schedule 1.

Schedule 1 Amendment

(Section 3)

Sections 24A and 24B

Insert after section 24:

24A Hotel trading hours on night of 2002 FIFA World Cup final

- (1) Despite any other provision of this Division, liquor may be sold, supplied or consumed on premises to which a hotelier's licence relates, and the premises may be kept open for the sale, supply or consumption of liquor, on Sunday 30 June 2002:
- (a) from 10 am to 10 pm, and
 - (b) from 10 pm to midnight on that day but only when the liquor is sold or supplied for consumption on the licensed premises.

- (2) This section does not authorise the sale, supply or consumption of liquor on any licensed premises contrary to a restriction or prohibition imposed, otherwise than under section 24, in respect of the trading hours for the licensed premises.

24B Hotel trading hours on Sundays when special events are held

- (1) This section applies to any Sunday the date of which is prescribed by the regulations for the purposes of this section.
- (2) The Minister may recommend the making of a regulation prescribing any such date only if the Minister is of the opinion that an event of State, national or international significance is to be held on that date.
- (3) Despite any other provision of this Division, liquor may be sold, supplied or consumed on premises to which a hotelier's licence relates, and the premises may be kept open for the sale, supply or consumption of liquor, on any day to which this section applies:
- (a) from 10 am to 10 pm, and
 - (b) from 10 pm to midnight on that day but only when the liquor is sold or supplied for consumption on the licensed premises.
- (4) This section does not authorise the sale, supply or consumption of liquor on any licensed premises contrary to a restriction or prohibition imposed, otherwise than under section 24, in respect of the trading hours for the licensed premises.
