An Act relating to certain legal proceedings instituted against the Registrar-General; and for purposes connected therewith.

1 Name of Act

This Act may be cited as the *Real Property (Legal Proceedings) Act 1970*.

2 In certain circumstances, certain provisions of Act No 25, 1900, not to apply

(1) In this section **prescribed proceedings** means proceedings instituted in the Supreme Court of New South Wales:

- (a) by Denton Subdivisions Pty. Limited (in liquidation), No 9218 of 1965, against Jack Hayward Watson the Registrar General of New South Wales, and
- (b) by Hermes Trading & Investment Pty. Limited, No 4114 of 1967, against Registrar General.

(2) If a plaintiff in prescribed proceedings:

- (a) had, before the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and seventy, a cause of action on which to found those proceedings, and
- (b) would, but for this Act, have been deprived of that cause of action by the coming into force of subsection five of section 33A of the *Real Property Act 1900*,

that subsection shall, for the purpose of the prescribed proceedings, be deemed not to have come into force.
