1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the *Sporting Venues (Invasions) Regulation 2006*.

2 Definition

In this Regulation, **the Act** means the *Sporting Venues (Invasions) Act 2003*.

3 Designated sporting venues

The EnergyAustralia Stadium in Newcastle (also known as Newcastle Stadium) is prescribed as a designated sporting venue for the purposes of the Act.
