Repeal

The Regulation was repealed by sec 4 (2) of the *State Revenue Legislation Amendment Act 2006* No 51 with effect from 30.6.2006.

Note

The Regulation was previously repealed by sec 4 (2) of the *State Revenue Legislation Further Amendment (No 2) Act 2001* No 96 and the repeal was revoked by sec 5 (1) of the *State Revenue Legislation Further Amendment Act 2004* No 67.

Sec 5 (2) to the *State Revenue Legislation Further Amendment Act 2004* No 67 provides that the Regulation is taken not to be, and never to have been, repealed by sec 10 of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1989*, and for the purposes of that sec is taken to have been published on the date of assent to the *State Revenue Legislation Further Amendment Act 2004* (ie 6.7.2004).

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1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the Petroleum Products Subsidy Regulation 1998.

2 Commencement

This Regulation commences on 1 September 1998.

3 Notes

The explanatory note does not form part of this Regulation.

4 Claims for payments: section 7

For the purposes of section 7 of the *Petroleum Products Subsidy Act 1965*, a claim for a payment under that Act:

- (a) must be made in the form made available for that purpose at an office of AusIndustry, and
- (b) must include such information as that form requires, and
- (c) must be signed by the registered distributor by whom the claim is made or by some other person authorised by the registered distributor to sign the claim, and
- (d) must be accompanied by a summary of the sales of eligible petroleum products to which the claim relates, and
- (e) must be posted to, or lodged at, an office of AusIndustry.

5 Repeal

The Petroleum Products Subsidy Regulation 1993 is repealed.
