# Wool, Hide and Skin Dealers Regulation 2010



Her Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following Regulation under the *Wool, Hide and Skin Dealers Act 2004*.

### 1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the Wool, Hide and Skin Dealers Regulation 2010.

#### 2 Commencement

This Regulation commences on 1 September 2010 and is required to be published on the NSW legislation website.

### Note-

This Regulation replaces the *Wool, Hide and Skin Dealers Regulation 2004* which is repealed on 1 September 2010 by section 10 (2) of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1989*.

## 3 Definition

(1) In this Regulation:

the Act means the Wool, Hide and Skin Dealers Act 2004.

(2) Notes included in this Regulation do not form part of this Regulation.

## 4 Manner of lodging licence application

For the purposes of section 10 (4) of the Act, delivering an application to a police station, or causing it to be delivered to a police station, is prescribed as the manner of lodging an application.
