Standard Time Amendment (Daylight Saving) Act 2007 No 44

Act No 44, 2007

An Act to amend the *Standard Time Act 1987* to extend the daylight saving period from the first Sunday in October to the first Sunday in April; and for other purposes.
[Assented to 1 November 2007]

The Legislature of New South Wales enacts:

1 Name of Act

This Act is the *Standard Time Amendment (Daylight Saving) Act 2007*.

2 Commencement

This Act commences on the date of assent to this Act.

3 Amendment of Standard Time Act 1987 No 149

The *Standard Time Act 1987* is amended as set out in Schedule 1.

4 Repeal of Act

- (1) This Act is repealed on the day following the day on which this Act commences.
- (2) The repeal of this Act does not, because of the operation of section 30 of the *Interpretation Act 1987*, affect any amendment made by this Act.

Schedule 1 Amendments

(Section 3)

[1] Section 2A Summer time period—definition

Omit section 2A (1) (a). Insert instead:

- (a) a period starting at 2 am on the first Sunday in October in each year and ending at 2 am on the first Sunday in the following April, or

[2] Section 2A (2)

Omit the subsection. Insert instead:

- (2) Despite subsection (1), the summer time period commencing in the year 2007 is taken to be the period starting at 2 am on Sunday 28 October 2007 and ending at 2 am on Sunday 6 April 2008.
